


* Lighting of the Advent Wreath

- P: During the season of Advent, we watch and wait for Christ's coming! And so we gather at this evergreen wreath to light candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, remembering the promises of God with prayer.
- P: Today is the Fourth Sunday in Advent. It is the Sunday of Love. We light this fourth candle as a remembrance that the coming of the Messiah, Jesus, showed the world what love truly looked like. It is a love that sets principles aside if it means treasuring the otherness of each individual; it is a love that forgives; a love that is self sacrificing. That is the love that Christ showed us reflecting the love of our heavenly father. And it is the love we are called to show one another.
- C: Come Emmanuel, Come.
- P: Hear the words of love spoken by God in Isaiah: The LORD spoke to Ahaz, saying, Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test. Then Isaiah said: "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel.
- P: Let us pray . . . God of hope, Prince of peace, Jubilee Judge, and Lord of love, your goodness is beyond our wildest imaginings. You give us more than we can think to ask, coming to us with impossible possibility in the union of flesh and spirit.
