
The New Testament Lesson Colossians 3:12-17


Serving the Community (continued...)

Stephen Ministry Training - Have you ever thought about wanting to help people during their times of need but didn't know what to say or how to help? That is what Stephen Ministers do for us here at St. Philip's. 
